HOPE CLINIC FOR WOMEN MISSION, VISION, VALUES:

Established in 1983, Hope Clinic for Women is a faith-based safe and confidential place equipping women, men and families dealing with: unplanned pregnancies, access to women's healthcare, prevention education, pregnancy loss (miscarriage, stillbirth, infant death, failed IVF/Adoption and abortion) and postpartum depression. We provide medical care, professional counseling, education classes, case management, mentor-ship and practical support regardless of age, race, religion or ability to pay.

Hope Clinic for Women is a Christ centered ministry existing to honor the sanctity of all human life as exemplified by:

- Teenagers and single adults choosing abstinence until marriage
- Women and men choosing life for their child in the midst of a pregnancy
- People experiencing God's grace and forgiveness after an abortion
- Transforming hearts and lives by discovering the purpose/potential God intends for all His children

We will carry out our mission and vision girded with the following values:

- Surrendering our daily walk to the authority and wisdom of Jesus Christ; bathing everything we do in prayer.
- Confidentiality for clients, volunteers, and donors.
- Unconditional love for each client, regardless of her decision.
- Speaking the truth in love about abstinence, STDs, abortion, adoption, parenting and post abortion.
- Being a living example of the Gospel and showing grace, unconditional love and mercy to our clients.
- Honoring the Sanctity of Life for the unborn child and the mother and father of the baby.
- By believing God is the author and defender of life, we are confident in His power to complete the work He began

INTERNSHIP PURPOSE:

To enable students to gain familiarity with nonprofit, social services, and counseling work.

QUALIFICATIONS:

Hope Clinic for Women is a non-denominational and faith-based Christian ministry. Our policy requires that all staff and interns have made a commitment to Jesus Christ.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Each student must complete additional on-site training before working with clients.
- All prospects must currently be working towards a degree that correlates with the services that are offered at Hope Clinic for Women (counseling, social work, family services, public health, etc.).
- Must be willing to commit to interning for 2 or more semesters.
- Must be available at least 2 hours per week.
- Applicants should have some interest in pregnancy care, social services, prevention education and services.
