An Annual Report from our 2021-2022 Fiscal Year October 1, 2021-September 30, 2022

Dear Champions,

The world is different since the last annual report you may have read. Yet in some ways, nothing has changed. The Dobbs decision that was released in June of this past year has sent waves across our nation and resulted in Tennessee's life-affirming legislation to take effect. For many, the world feels completely different, but when people ask me, "How does this change affect Hope Clinic?" my answer is the same: Hope Clinic continues to provide high quality healthcare, counseling, education, and support for women facing an unplanned pregnancy. We continue to remove obstacles in the way of her choosing life. What we have observed, with 40 years of experience at our backs, is all the reasons a woman considers an abortion still exist. That is why we must press on. We must press on into deeper waters.

I'm grateful for the renewed vigor around Middle Tennessee and the nation for what some have coined the "pro-life safety net" -- organizations like us that are here to catch women now in states like Tennessee. We are strengthening our community partnerships with other organizations who may not even realize they are part of this safety net: housing assistance programs, food banks, job readiness programs, childcare facilities. It will take all of us because it has always taken all of us.

I'm excited to share this annual report with you that highlights the consistent work we were able to achieve this year. One particularly exciting area of growth was our relationship education program. We grew from serving just over 600 students in 2020-2021 to serving 2,400 participants this past year! I am even more excited to dream with you about the next 40 years at our anniversary Gala coming up on March 23rd. Nashville needs more from us, and we want to dream creatively about what that could mean and how we can rise to the occasion with all of our services.

Thank you to our supporters that made this incredible year possible and set us up for success for the years to come! Let's continue dreaming together!

OUR MISSION

🖥 stablished in 1983, Hope Clinic for Women is a faith-based safe and confidential place equipping women, men and families dealing with: unplanned pregnancies, access to women's healthcare, prevention education, pregnancy loss (miscarriage, stillbirth, infant death, failed IVF/Adoption and abortion) and postpartum depression. We provide medical care, professional counseling, education classes, case management, mentor-ship and practical support regardless of age, race, religion or ability to pay.

OUR SERVICES

PREGNANCY

Pregnancy tests, pregnancy options counseling*, 1st prenatal visit ultrasound, access to our Bridge Program, including mentoring, counseling, prenatal and parenting classes, referrals to partner agencies, and material assistance (diapers, wipes, accessories, etc). Provided free of charge.

*We answer questions and educate people on abortions, but we do not perform or refer for them.

WOMEN'S HEALTHCARE

Women's full annual well visit (breast exam, pelvic exam, pap smears, STD testing) and all related problems (STD, yeast infection, blood test, irregular bleeding, etc.). Provided at a nominal fee.

PREVENTION EDUCATION

Our staff are certified Sexual Risk Avoidance Educators who educate on healthy relationships, self-esteem, boundaries, consent, STDs, abstinence and more. Geared to middle/high school, college students and youth leaders. Provided free of charge.

COUNSELING

Pregnancy loss (miscarriage, stillbirth, infant death, failed IVF, and failed adoption), Post-abortion, Peripartum Mood Disorders (PPD, PMADs), related relationship issues (unhealthy relationships, sexual addiction, and pornography). Provided on a sliding scale.

PREGNANCY SERVICES



Women came in for initial pregnancy testing and counseling

- 55% of these women reported having no medical insurance
- 98% felt more informed of their choices after their first visit
- 78% of positive test clients came back for follow up ultrasound visits/care; For those coming back for follow up care:
 - -85% of those women choose life for their child
 - -57% were active in the Pregnancy Bridge Program. This allowed them access to free (onsite and online) counseling, case management, education classes, and spiritual mentorship in exchange for material assistance
 - -97% of these women felt better educated and more equipped about pre/post-natal care
 - -22 clients graduated from the program



Students, 175 parents, and 24 teachers at 20 schools and agencies (St. Bernard Academy, Franklin Road Academy, Nashville Christian, Wright Middle, Boys and Girls Club of Middle TN, Otter Creek Church of Christ, Ezell-Harding, Hillwood, YQuest, East End Prep, RePublic High, LEAD, KIPP, YCAP Robertson, Saint Henry's) received our in-depth sexual risk avoidance education.

- 97% felt treated with respect
- 95% felt more able and equipped to speak to a trusted adult about sex and health relationships
- 93% felt better equipped to resist the pressures to have sex
- · 85% committed to abstinence


COUNSELING

Women and men came in for pregnancy loss, postpartum depression, or other related women's and couples' issues completing over 750 sessions.

- Our online post abortion recovery group grew exponentially by serving 60 unique participants (140% increase!)
- 100% of patients said they were better able to cope with their mental health concerns and made progress towards their goals.


